Oriana Skylar Mastro is a doctoral candidate in the Politics department at Princeton University where she focuses on military operations and strategy, war termination, and Northeast Asia. She is author of the forthcoming article “Signaling and Military Provocation in Chinese National Security Strategy: a Closer Look at the Impeccable Incident” in the *Journal of Strategic Studies* as well as coauthor of two chapters in *Assessing the Threat: The Chinese Military and Taiwan's Security*. She has worked on US-China policy issues at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, RAND Corporation, US Pacific Command at Pearl Harbor, Project 2049 Institute, and the US Department of Defense. Highly proficient in Mandarin Chinese, she worked at a Chinese valve-manufacturing firm in Beijing, makes frequent appearances on a Chinese-language debate show, and is a charter member of DoD’s National Language Service Corps. Though originally from Chicago, she holds a B.A. in East Asian Studies with honors in International Security from Stanford University.
