Ms. Madeline Earp researches internet freedom throughout Asia for Freedom House's Freedom on the Net program. She is fluent in Chinese and an expert on restrictions facing new and traditional media in China. Prior to joining Freedom House, Ms. Earp worked at the Committee to Protect Journalists and Human Rights in China. She testified before the Commission in 2009.

She has published considerable research on Chinese press freedom issues. Most recently, she contributed to a March 2013 report published by the Committee to Protect Journalists, "Challenged in China: The shifting dynamics of censorship and control." She is the author of the upcoming China country report for Freedom House's 2013 Freedom on the Net survey.

Ms. Earp received a master's degree in East Asian studies from Harvard University and a bachelor's in English literature from Cambridge University. She studied Mandarin in China and was awarded a British Association for Chinese Studies scholarship to Chung Kung University in Taiwan in 2004.
