Regina Abrami is a Senior Fellow at Harvard Business School, with primary expertise in comparative political economy. Her research focuses on the political economy of entrepreneurship, national industrial strategy, and emerging markets, with emphasis on China. She is a frequent commentator on managing in a global context, most recently regarding the globalization of Chinese companies, Chinese industrial policy, and the relation between non-market institutions and business strategy.

At HBS, Dr. Abrami has taught in the MBA, executive education, and doctoral programs, including the required MBA course, "Business, Government, and the International Economy," and an elective course, "Doing Business in China," that she designed and has taught for several years. Dr. Abrami is on the executive committee of Harvard University's Fairbank Center for Chinese Studies and is a Faculty Associate of the Weatherhead Center for International Affairs. From 2008-2011, she served as the faculty chair of HBS's inaugural MBA international field immersion program. She is also the author of nearly thirty HBS cases.

Dr. Abrami earned her Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of California, Berkeley, where she was both a Reinhard Bendix and John L. Simpson Memorial Fellow. Her research has been supported by the Social Science Research Council, the Committee on Scholarly Communication with China, the Institute of World Politics, and Fulbright. Her work has been published in the Harvard Business Review, Comparative Politics, Journal of East Asian Studies, among others.
