



Weiping Wu, Ph.D., Professor and Chair, Department of Urban and Environmental Policy and Planning, Tufts University

Weiping Wu is a professor and chair of the Department of Urban and Environmental Policy and Planning at Tufts University. She holds a Ph.D. in Urban Planning and Policy Development from Rutgers University, and a Master's degree in Urban Planning and a bachelor's degree in Architecture from Tsinghua University (China). She is a former editor of the *Journal of Planning Education and Research*. At Tufts, she also is a senior fellow in the Council for Emerging Market Enterprises at The Fletcher School. Previously, she was a professor of urban studies and planning and international studies at Virginia Commonwealth University, a consultant to the World Bank, and a fellow in the Public Intellectuals Program of the National Committee on United States-China Relations. Her research focuses on migration and urbanization, urban infrastructure and finance, and China's urban development. The National Science Foundation, U.S. Department of Education, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Lincoln Institute of Land Policy, and World Bank have funded her research. She has (co)authored and co-edited seven books, the most recent published in 2013 by Routledge titled *The Chinese City*.
