## Barry Naughton So Kwanlok Chair of International Affairs, School of Global Policy and Strategy, University of California, San Diego



Barry Naughton is the So Kwanlok Professor at the School of Global Policy and Strategy, University of California, San Diego. Naughton's work on the Chinese economy focuses on market transition; industry and technology; foreign trade; and political economy. His first book, *Growing Out of the Plan*, won the Ohira Prize in 1996. Naughton did his dissertation research in China in 1982 and received his Ph.D. in Economics from Yale University in 1986. He is currently coordinator of GPS's new MCEPA Program (Master's in Chinese Economic and Political Affairs) and is working on a new book on China's industrial policy.

Dr. Naughton has written the authoritative textbook on China's economy, <u>The Chinese Economy:</u> <u>Transitions and Growth</u> (2006), and published a second edition of that book, <u>The Chinese Economy:</u> <u>Adaptation and Growth</u> (2018). Among his other publications are <u>State Capitalism, Institutional</u> <u>Adaptation, and the Chinese Miracle</u> (2015), which he edited with Kellee S. Tsai.

Dr. Naughton testified before the Commission in its 2011 hearing on "Chinese State-Owned Enterprises and U.S.-China Bilateral Investment," its 2007 hearing on "The Extent of the Government's Control of China's Economy, and Implications for the United States," and its 2004 hearing on "China as an Emerging Regional and Technology Power—Implications for U.S. Economic and Security Interests."
