## Dr. Yuen Yuen Ang

Associate Professor, University of Michigan



Yuen Yuen Ang is Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of Michigan, and a graduate of Colorado College and Stanford University. She is the author of *China's Gilded Age: The Paradox of Economic Boom and Vast Corruption* (2020) and *How China Escaped the Poverty Trap* (2016). She is the inaugural recipient of the Theda Skocpol Prize, awarded by the American Political Science Association for "impactful contributions to the study of comparative politics." She is also an Andrew Carnegie Fellow. *Foreign Affairs* named her essay "Autocracy with Chinese Characteristics" among the Best of Print in 2018. One area of her research is policy communication: how and why the Chinese central party-state communicates instructions to the bureaucracy in certain ways. Her latest research examines what China's state-led innovation drive has and has not been able to accomplish.
