

## **Dr. David Keegan**

**Retired Foreign Service Officer and Adjunct Lecturer, Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies**



David Keegan is an adjunct lecturer in the Chinese Studies Program at Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies, where he teaches a seminar on Taiwan and its relations with the United States and Mainland China. Prior to his academic career, Dr. Keegan served as a Foreign Service Officer in the U.S. State Department for thirty years, specializing in China, Taiwan, and the Asia Pacific region. He completed tours in Jamaica, Korea, China, Taiwan, Singapore, and New Zealand. Dr. Keegan's federal service included stints as the Deputy Director of the American Institute in Taiwan and the Director of the Office of Taiwan Policy in the Bureau of East Asian and Pacific Affairs at the U.S. Department of State. He retired from the Foreign Service in 2012. He is the author of the 2014 Wilson Center report *The Taiwan Relations Act: Still Essential in Changing Times*.

Dr. Keegan holds a Ph.D. in Chinese History from the University of California, Berkeley.
