Kharis Templeman is a visiting fellow at the Hoover Institution and lecturer in East Asian Studies at Stanford University. His areas of expertise include Taiwan politics, democratic transitions and consolidations, parties and elections, and the political economy of defense in Taiwan. He is also a member of the U.S.-Taiwan Next Generation Working Group. Prior to joining the Hoover Institution, Dr. Templeman was a social science research scholar at Stanford University's Freeman Spogli Institute for International Studies. He is the author of many articles, book chapters, and policy reports on Taiwan's relationship with China, including most recently [*Dynamics of Democracy in Taiwan: The Ma Ying-jeou Years*](#) (2020), [*How Taiwan Stands Up to China*](#) (2020), and [*Democracy Under Siege: Advancing Cooperation and Common Values in the Indo-Pacific*](#) (2020).

He holds a B.A. in Political Science from the University of Rochester and a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Michigan.
