Mark R. Cozad is a senior international defense research analyst at RAND. His work at RAND focuses on military and security issues in Europe and East Asia, including major power competition, the development of joint operations concepts among major militaries, and how foreign powers perform military net assessment. Before joining RAND, Mr. Cozad served in both the military and the intelligence community, including stints as the Deputy Assistant Deputy Director of National Intelligence for the President’s Daily Brief and the Defense Intelligence Officer for East Asia.

Mr. Cozad's publications include co-authored research reports through RAND, including the recently-released *People's Liberation Army Operational Concepts* (2020) and *People's Liberation Army Air Force Operations over Water: Maintaining Relevance in China's Changing Security Environment* (2017).

Mr. Cozad holds a B.S. in political science from the U.S. Air Force Academy; an M.S. in history from George Mason University; and an M.S. in strategic intelligence from the Defense Intelligence College.
