

Francisco Urdinez, Ph.D.

Associate Professor, Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile



Francisco Urdinez is an Associate Professor at the Institute of Political Science and an affiliated researcher at the Center of International Studies and Center of Asian Studies, Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile (PUC). He obtained his PhD in International Relations in 2017 as part of a joint degree program between King's College London, UK, and the University of Sao Paulo, Brazil. His PhD thesis, which addresses China's economic statecraft in Latin America, received a grant from the São Paulo Research Foundation (FAPESP) and a grant from the Brazilian National Council for Scientific and Technological Development (CNPq). Dr. Urdinez offers a course on China's relations with Latin America in the master's program of Political Science, and International Political Economy at the undergraduate level. In 2021 Dr. Urdinez received the Teaching Excellence Award by the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile.

Dr Urdinez' research has been published in Comparative Political Studies, the Journal of Peace Research, the Chinese Journal of International Politics, Foreign Policy Analysis, among other high-ranked academic journals. Currently, he is the main researcher of the project "The International Politics of China's Rising Role in Financing Infrastructure" (2018-2021).

Dr. Urdinez was a consultant for the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) in 2019 and has written reports for the Carnegie Endowment of International Peace, the Latin American Development Bank and the Pacific Alliance. In 2020 he was a Visiting Professor at Science Po Aix, France, where he offered a course on China-Latin American Relations. He is a member of the Latin American Network of Political Economy (REPAL).
