

Abraham Denmark

Director of the Asia Program, Wilson Center



Mr. Denmark leads the Wilson Center’s research on the geopolitical dynamics of the Indo-Pacific and contributes to its industry-leading analysis on U.S.-China relations. In addition to his duties at the Wilson Center, he is an Adjunct Associate Professor at Georgetown University.

Mr. Denmark is the author of *U.S. Strategy in the Asian Century: Empowering Allies and Partners* (Columbia University Press, 2020). He has testified multiple times before the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, and his commentary has been featured in major media outlets, including *Foreign Affairs*, the *Atlantic*, the *New York Times*, and the *Washington Post*.

Mr. Denmark previously served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for East Asia (2015 – January 2017), where he advised the Secretary of Defense and other senior U.S. government leaders on a broad set of security issues related to East Asia, including the development and implementation of U.S. defense strategies, plans, policies, statements, and activities in the region. In this role, he strengthened U.S. military posture in the region, oversaw U.S. military-to-military relations with China, and managed DoD responses to multiple North Korean provocations.

Before joining the Pentagon, Mr. Denmark was a Senior Vice President at the National Bureau of Asian Research, where he was the co-editor of the landmark Strategic Asia book series. He also held analytic positions at the Center for a New American Security and in the U.S. Intelligence Community.

Mr. Denmark previously testified at the Commission’s June 2019 hearing titled, “A ‘World-Class’ Military: Assessing China’s Global Military Ambitions” and June 2017 hearing titled, “China’s Relations with Northeast Asia and Continental Southeast Asia.”
