Dean Cheng is the senior research fellow in Asian Studies at the Heritage Foundation. He specializes in China's military and foreign policy, including its relationship with the rest of Asia and with the United States. Cheng has written extensively on China's military doctrine, the technological implications of its space program, and "dual use" issues associated with the communist nation's industrial and scientific infrastructure.

Prior to his position at the Heritage Foundation, Cheng worked in senior analytical roles at the Science Applications International Corp. (SAIC) and the China Studies division of the Center for Naval Analyses (CNA). He was also an analyst in the International Security and Space Program at the Office of Technology Assessment.

Cheng is regularly interviewed by public affairs shows and media outlets. Recent relevant publications include "The US-Japan Alliance and Deterring Gray Zone Coercion in the Maritime, Cyber, and Space Domains" (2017) and *Cyber Dragon: Inside China's Information Warfare and Cyber Operations* (2016).

Mr. Cheng testified most recently at the Commission's 2019 hearing on "'World-Class' Military: Assessing China's Global Military Ambitions." He has also testified at the Commission's 2015 hearing on "China's Space and Counterspace Programs," 2011 hearing on "China's Active Defense Strategy and Its Regional Impact," and 2007 hearing on "China's Military Modernization and Its Impact on the United States and the Asia-Pacific."
