Emily Meierding is an Assistant Professor in the Department of National Security Affairs at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California. Her current research focuses on international disputes over energy resources, petrostates' political stability, energy sanctions, and great powers' competition for international influence. She is the author of *The Oil Wars Myth: Petroleum and the Causes of International Conflict* (Cornell University Press, 2020). Her work has also appeared in *Security Studies*, *Comparative Politics*, the *International Studies Review*, *Energy Research & Social Science*, *Foreign Policy*, and the *Washington Post*.

Dr. Meierding earned her Ph.D. from the University of Chicago. Before joining the Naval Postgraduate School, she was a fellow at the Center for International Security and Cooperation (CISAC) at Stanford University and a faculty member at the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies in Geneva, Switzerland.
