He pursued clients' interests through the development of legislative options on trade-related issues and the evaluation of regulations and practices of countries where clients were active.

He has worked with a wide variety of companies and unions globally to solve trade and other matters, including in agriculture, consumer goods, electronics, metals, mining, automotive, industrial equipment, energy, and other industries. Mr. Stewart has written extensively on and edited numerous publications regarding international trade and investment, including unfair trade laws, GATT and WTO issues, and trade relations with China and other U.S. trading partners.

Mr. Stewart served as an advisor to the Government of Ukraine for roughly a decade during its efforts to accede to the WTO. He has received an Honorary Degree Order of Merit of the 3rd Degree from the Government of Ukraine, an Honorary Doctorate from the Ukrainian Academy of Foreign Trade and an Honorary Doctorate of Political Science from the Russian Academy of Sciences. Mr. Stewart writes regularly for his blog, *Current Thoughts on Trade*.
