Jennifer Brick Murtazashvili is the Founding Director of the Center for Governance and Markets and Associate Professor at the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs at the University of Pittsburgh. Her research focuses on issues of security, political economy, and governance in Central Asia, South Asia, and across the Eurasian landmass. She is a nonresident scholar at the Asia Program at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace.

Dr. Murtazashvili is the author of *Informal Order and the State in Afghanistan* (Cambridge University Press, 2016), which received the Best Book Award in Social Sciences by the Central Eurasian Studies Society and received honorable mention from the International Development Section of the International Studies Association. and *Land, the State, and War: Property Institutions and Political Order in Afghanistan* (with Ilia Murtazashvili) (Cambridge University Press, 2021). Murtazashvili served as a Democracy and Governance Officer for the United States Agency for International Development in Tashkent, Uzbekistan and as a Researcher at the Afghanistan Research and Evaluation Unit. She has advised the World Bank, the US Department of Defense, the United Nations Development Program, and UNICEF. She served as a US Peace Corps Volunteer in Samarkand, Uzbekistan.

She is the President of the Central Eurasian Studies Society and a member of PONARS Eurasia, a research organization focused on security issues in Eurasia. She previously served as a nonresident senior fellow at the Atlantic Council's Eurasia Center.
