John VerWey is an East Asia National Security Advisor at Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL), one of the Department of Energy Office of Science Laboratories. In this role, he uses his background in strategic trade controls and U.S.-China technology competition to support U.S. government export control, supply chain security, and nonproliferation missions. He also serves as a consultant to Georgetown University's Center for Security and Emerging Technology (CSET).

Before joining PNNL he worked for the U.S. Trade Representative, where he was a staff-liaison to the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS), the U.S. International Trade Commission, and the Bureau of Industry and Security at the U.S. Department of Commerce. In those positions he analyzed the effects of international trade, supply chains, Chinese industrial policies, export controls, and foreign direct investment on advanced technology industries, with a focus on microelectronics. Prior to government service, he consulted for The European Parliament's Internal Market and Consumer Protection Committee and worked as a program manager at the American Enterprise Institute.

He holds a graduate degree in international political economy from the London School of Economics and undergraduate degrees in Asian studies and history from Gonzaga University.
