## Scott Rozelle

**Dr. Scott Rozelle** holds the Helen F. Farnsworth Endowed Professorship at Stanford University and is Senior Fellow in the Freeman Spogli Institute (FSI) for International Studies and is Co-Director of the Stanford Center on China's Economy and Institutions (SCCEI). Dr. Rozelle, a development economist with a Ph.d. from Cornell University, has worked on the economics of rural China for nearly 40 years.

Dr. Rozelle's papers have been published in top academic journals, including *Science*, *Nature*, *American Economic Review*, and the *Journal of Economic Literature*. He has also co-authored multiple books, including *Invisible China: How the Urban-Rural Divide Threatens China's Rise* which draws on extensive surveys on the ground in China. He also serves on the editorial boards of *Economic Development and Cultural Change*, *Agricultural Economics*, the *Australian Journal of Agricultural and Resource Economics*, and the *China Economic Review*. Currently, his work focuses on human capital and China's future growth and development, including issues of rural health, nutrition and education, including early childhood development.

Dr. Rozelle received his BS from the University of California, Berkeley, and his MS and PhD from Cornell University.
