Dr. Andrew Chubb is a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Politics, Philosophy and Religion at Lancaster University, Director of the Lancaster University China Centre, and a Fellow at the Asia Society's Center for China Analysis. A graduate of the University of Western Australia, Andrew's academic research examines the linkages between Chinese domestic politics and international relations, maritime and territorial disputes, strategic communication, political propaganda, and Chinese Communist Party history. The author of *Chinese Nationalism and the Gray Zone: Case Analyses of Public Opinion and PRC Foreign Policy* (Naval War College Press, 2021) and *PRC Overseas Political Activities: Risk, Reaction and the Case of Australia* (Routledge and Royal United Services Institute, 2021), Andrew is principal investigator of the project Domestic Public Opinion and International Crisis Escalation: Perceptions and Crisis Control in the Shadow of Networked Nationalism, funded by the British Academy. Andrew is a member of the UK-based Academic Freedom and Internationalisation Working Group, which developed a model code of conduct for universities to protect academic freedom while pursuing internationalisation.
