Dr. Tai Ming Cheung

Professor at University of California, San Diego and Director of the UC Institute on Global Conflict and Cooperation



Dr. Tai Ming Cheung is director of the University of California-wide Institute on Global Conflict and Cooperation, and a professor in the School of Global Policy and Strategy at the University of California, San Diego. His areas of research focus include China's efforts to become a world-class science and technology power, and the relationship between geoeconomics, innovation, and national security. His book *Fortifying China: The Struggle to Build a Modern Defense Economy* was published in 2009. His latest book is *Innovate to Dominate: The Rise of the Chinese Techno-Security State* (Cornell University Press, August 2022). Dr. Cheung is a long-time analyst of Chinese and East Asian defense and national security affairs. He was previously a correspondent at the Far Eastern Economic Review. He was also a journalist and political and business risk consultant in northeast Asia. Dr. Cheung has a PhD in War Studies from King's College, London.

Dr. Cheung has testified before the Commission twice, most recently at its 2010 hearing titled "China's Emergent Military Aerospace and Commercial Aviation Capabilities."
