Diego Zambrano Associate Professor of Law, Stanford University



Diego A. Zambrano's primary research and teaching interests lie in the areas of civil procedure, transnational litigation, judicial federalism, and comparative constitutional law. Mr. Zambrano serves as the current chair of the Section on Federal Courts for the Association of American Law Schools. Professor Zambrano is an award-winning teacher and researcher and his scholarship has appeared in top law reviews and journals. Among other things, he has written about the regulatory role of litigation, foreign dictators in U.S. court, the centrality of discovery in the civil litigation process, private enforcement schemes in state law, and the relationship between state and federal courts. He currently leads an innovative Stanford Policy Lab tracking "Global Trends in Judicial Reforms." After graduating with honors from Harvard Law School in 2013, Professor Zambrano spent three years as an associate at Cleary Gottlieb in New York, focusing on transnational litigation and arbitration.
