Mr. Andrew Small is a Senior Transatlantic Fellow with German Marshal Fund's (GMF) Indo-Pacific Program, based in the Berlin office. His research focuses on U.S.—China relations, Europe—China relations, Chinese policy in South Asia, and broader developments in China's foreign and economic policy. He is the author of *The Rupture: China and the Global Race for the Future* and *No Limits: the Inside Story of China's War with the West*, which was named one of the 2022 *Financial Times* Politics Books of the Year, and *The China-Pakistan Axis: Asia's New Geopolitics*.

He was based in GMF's Brussels office for five years and the DC office for ten years, and has worked as a visiting fellow at the European Council on Foreign Relations, the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences, and as an ESU scholar in the office of Senator Edward M. Kennedy. His articles and papers have been published in *Foreign Affairs*, *The New York Times*, and many other journals, magazines, and newspapers. Small was educated at Balliol College, University of Oxford.

Mr. Small has testified before the Commission seven times, most recently at its September 2020 Hearing on "U.S.-China Relations in 2020: Enduring Problems and Emerging Challenges."
