

## **Tim Rühlig**

**Senior Research Fellow at the German Council on Foreign Relations (DGAP)**



**Dr. Tim Rühlig** is a senior research fellow at the German Council on Foreign Relations (DGAP) researching Europe-China relations, Chinese foreign and industrial policy including high technology and Hong Kong politics. His current projects focus on China's growing footprint in technical standardization, the emerging US-China technology rivalry and its implications for Europe as well as the politics of Hong Kong. He is also an associate researcher at The Swedish Institute of International Affairs (Utrikespolitiska institutet, UI).

Tim Rühlig is an observer to the European Commission's High-level on European Standardisation and a of the China Task Force of the European Standardization Organizations. Since 2019, he is a member of the Management Committee and the Core Group of the EU-funded COST Action "Europe in China Research Network" (CHERN); he is also chairman of CHERN's Working Group "High technology and Innovation".

Rühlig is a participant of the European Think-tank Network on China (ETNC) that he has coordinated in 2018.

Tim Rühlig holds a PhD from Frankfurt University with a thesis on sovereign state control in China's foreign policy. In 2022, he published his monography *China's Foreign Policy Contradictions* with Oxford University Press. Before obtaining his PhD, he studied International Relations and Peace and Conflict Research (MA, Frankfurt University and Technical University of Darmstadt) as well as Political Science and Cultural Anthropology (Tübingen University).
