Tetsuo Kotani is a senior fellow at the Japan Institute of International Affairs (JIIA) and a professor of global studies at Meikai University. His research focus is Japan’s foreign and security policy, the U.S.-Japan alliance, and international relations and maritime security in the Indo-Pacific region. He won the 2003 Japanese Defense Minister Prize. Kotani has published numerous articles both in English and Japanese, including “Crisis Management in the East China Sea” (SIPRI Policy Brief, 2015) and “China’s Military and Paramilitary Activities in the East China Sea: Implications for the U.S.-Japan Alliance” (National Bureau of Asian Research, 2020). He received a Master’s degree from Doshisha University.
