Cory Combs is Associate Director at political economy research firm Trivium China. He oversees the company's cross-cutting climate, energy, and industrial policy research and runs its supply chain risk advisory services, supporting government agencies, multinational manufacturers, mining companies, and investors on China policy and strategy. He is a member of the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations and a regular speaker at conferences and events in the US, EU, and Asia. He is regularly cited in US and international media, contributing analysis to AP, Reuters, the Wall Street Journal, the Washington Post, the Financial Times, S&P Global, Bloomberg, Politico, and National Geographic, among others. Previously, he worked on energy technology commercialization at the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), serving on the portfolio management team for the DOE Loan Programs Office's then \$20 billion investment portfolio. He is a contributing author in the Springer Nature Handbook of Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation (4th edition) and has produced both public policy and peer-reviewed academic research on Chinese industrial policy, energy system reform, and critical minerals investment.

Mr. Combs studied astrophysics and philosophy at Yale University and received his master's (with Honors) from Johns Hopkins SAIS, where he studied energy economics and Chinese politics. He was a Yale-China Fellow in Changsha, Hunan province and was twice awarded the Starr Excellence in China Studies Fellowship by Johns Hopkins SAIS.
