Kate Logan is Director of Climate Diplomacy at the Asia Society Policy Institute, where her work focuses on the drivers of climate action across Asia and in China especially. She is also a fellow with ASPI's Center for China Analysis. For over a decade, she has followed and analyzed China's climate, energy and environmental performance at think tanks, philanthropies, and nonprofits, with a particular focus on China's domestic environmental governance, the U.S.-China climate relationship, and Chinese overseas engagement. She began her career in Beijing, China, as a Princeton in Asia Fellow, and lived there for over five years.

Ms. Logan holds a master's from Yale University's School of the Environment and a bachelor's from Middlebury College in East Asian Studies with a focus on economics. She is a fellow with the Penn Project on the Future of U.S.-China Relations (2024 cohort) and is a member of the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations. She is professionally proficient in Mandarin Chinese.
