

People’s Republic of China (PRC) Representation in International Organizations

Note on methodology: This memo identifies Chinese nationals serving as the heads of key international organizations and in other top leadership positions in United Nations (UN) principal organs, UN funds and programs, UN specialized agencies, other UN entities and bodies, international trade and financial institutions, and international standards organizations. Top leadership positions are broadly defined as positions at the board of directors and senior management team level. Evidence for United Front connections is also noted, where applicable. United Front connections are defined as membership of groups known to carry out China’s united front work, or honored at high profile united front events. This document reflects data as of May 16, 2025, and will be updated on an annual basis.

He has a degree from Shanghai International Studies University and attended post-graduate studies at Beijing Foreign Studies University. In addition, he has an MSc in financial economics from University of London and an MA in international relations from Webster University.

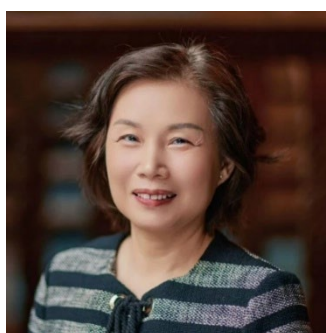
technical analysis for the Committee's work reviewing the inclusion in and graduation from the list of Least Developed Countries. She is a graduate of Peking University and New York University.⁶

She is a Professor of Technology and International Development at the University of Oxford and a Fellow of Green Templeton College.¹² In 2024, she was appointed as director of the Oxford Advanced Research Centres (OARC), which owns the Oxford Suzhou Centre for Advanced Research (OSCAR). She is also the Founding Director of the Technology and Management Centre for Development (TMCD), a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences and Founder of OxValue.AI. Her research focuses on trade, technology and industrialization, economic development, emerging Asian economies and innovation and productivity in the UK and US. Professor Fu has consulted for UNDESA, UNCTAD, UNIDO, the World Bank, the OECD, the European Commission, the ILO, the Commonwealth Secretariat, UKTI and the Chinese government. Prior to this position, she served as China's Ambassador to the Netherlands from 2003 to 2008. Before that, she was the Director-General in the Department of Treaty and Law from 1999 to 2003 as well as the Deputy Director-General in the Department of Treaty and Law from 1994 to 1999. She earned a BA from Beijing Foreign Language Studies University in 1980, an LL.M. from Columbia University School of Law in 1983, and a JSD from Columbia University School of Law in 1995.

Haoliang XU (徐浩良), UN Under-Secretary-General and UNDP Associate Administrator:¹⁸ Mr. Xu was appointed as Under-Secretary-General and Associate Administrator of UNDP in June 2023.¹⁹ Prior to his current appointment, Mr. Xu held the roles of UN Assistant Secretary-General and Director of Bureau for Policy and Program Support from 2019. Previously, he served as the UN Assistant-Secretary General and UNDP Assistant Administrator and Regional Director for Asia and the Pacific from 2013 to July 2019.²⁰

Members of the Court are independent judges whose first task, before taking up their duties, is to make a solemn declaration in open court that they will exercise their powers impartially and conscientiously." Jian LIU (刘健), Director of Early Warning and Assessment Division:²² Dr. Liu is currently the Director of the Early Warning and Assessment Division. From 2017 to 2021, he also served as the Chief Scientist of the UN Environment Program. From 2011 to 2016, he was the founding Director of UNEP's International Ecosystem Management Partnership (IMEP). From 2008 to 2010, he established UNEP's first Climate Change Adaptation Unit as the founding Chief. He was first appointed to the UN in 2005, where he was the Deputy Secretary of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change until 2007. Prior to joining the UN, he worked mainly at the Chinese Academy of Sciences from 1986 to 2004, where he took on a number of senior posts such as the Deputy Director General of the Bureau of Resources and Environment and Director of the Chinese Ecosystem Research Network, among other posts. Dongyu QU (屈冬玉), Director-General:²⁷ Dr. Qu first took office as the ninth Director-General of the FAO in August 2019 and was re-elected for a second four-year term in July 2023. He also represents the FAO as a board member of the UN System Chief Executives Board for Coordination.²⁸ Before coming to the FAO, Dr. Qu served as PRC Vice Minister of Agriculture and Rural Affairs.²⁹ Prior to this, he served as Vice Governor (2011–2015) and Assistant Governor (2008–2011) of Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region; Vice President of the Chinese Academy of Agricultural Sciences (CAAS) (2001–2008); and Deputy Director General in the Human Resources Department for the China Three Gorges Project Development Corporation (2005–2006).³⁰ Between 1986 and 2002, he served in a series of research and leadership positions at the CAAS Institute of Vegetables and Flowers.³¹ Dr. Qu studied horticultural science at Hunan Agricultural University and then plant breeding and genetics at the Chinese Academy of Agricultural Sciences. He later added environmental science to his knowledge portfolio while earning a PhD at Wageningen University in the Netherlands.

Guoqi WU (吴国起), Associate Vice-President, Corporate Services Department:³³ Dr. Wu joined the IFAD as the Associate Vice-President of the Corporate Services Department in July 2018.³⁴ Dr. Wu oversees human resources, administrative services, safety and security, and information technology resources for IFAD. For over 20 years, Dr. Wu has worked with international financial institutions to promote global development cooperation. He was previously the Alternate Director for China at the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) and the New Development Bank (NDB), where he was involved in a number of strategies, operational policies, business plans and budgets, and investment projects in addition to working on membership expansion and partnership agreements. Before serving in these positions, he worked as the Alternate Executive Director for China at the Asian Development Bank (ADB). Prior to that, he served in the Chinese Ministry of Finance (MOF) in various positions, including Chief of the G20/BRICS Division. Ms. Wang was first appointed to IFAD in October 2017 in the position of Chief, Asia and Pacific Liaison Office in the Partnership and Resource Mobilization Office and Special Adviser to the President.³⁷ Prior to joining IFAD, Ms. Wang served as the Director of Financial and Risk Management Division in the Department of International Economic and Financial Cooperation of the Chinese Ministry of Finance. She holds an MBA from McNeese State University in Louisiana in 1994 and a BS from Renmin University of China in 1991.³⁸

The Directorate of Technical Cooperation and Sustainable Industrial Development oversees the organization's contribution to sustainable development goals in addition to supporting and advancing the application of strategies and interventions for sustainable industrial development in the environment, energy, and subject matter expert areas. Mr. Zou is also the Director General's Special Representative for the G77 and China. Mr. Zou has worked at UNIDO since 2013 and was the architect of UNIDO's Program for Country Partnership. Prior to joining UNIDO, he performed multiple roles, including the Deputy Director General of the International Department at the Chinese Ministry of Finance, Alternate to the Chinese Executive Director at the World Bank, and Global Environment Facility Operational Focal Point for China. Dr. Ailan LI (李爱兰), Assistant Director-General, Universal Health Coverage, Healthier Populations:⁵¹ Dr. Ailan Li was appointed Assistant Director-General of the Healthier Populations Division of WHO's Universal Health Coverage program in 2023.⁵² Between 2019 and 2023 she served as the WHO representative to Cambodia, and prior to this held positions in the WHO Regional Office for the Western Pacific as Regional Emergency Director for the WHO Health Emergencies Programme and Director of the Division of Health Security and Emergencies.⁵³ Prior to joining the WHO in 2002, she was an Associate Professor at Peking University's School of Public Health and a Program Officer at China's Ministry of Health.⁵⁴ She is a member of the advisory committee of the publication Chinese Center for Disease Control Weekly.⁵⁵ She holds a medical degree from Beijing Medical University in China and a master's degree in health social science from Mahidol University in Thailand. Binying WANG (王彬颖), Deputy Director General – Brands and Designs Sector:⁵⁷ Ms. Wang has served as the Deputy Director General for the Brands and Designs Sector since 2009.⁵⁸ Ms. Wang has held a series of leadership positions at WIPO. In early 2020, Ms. Wang ran as China’s nominee in a high-profile race for WIPO Director General, where she was ultimately defeated by Daren Tang of Singapore.⁵⁹ She currently administers three other programs under WIPO: the Madrid System for the International Registration of Marks, the Hague System for the International Registration of Industrial Designs, and the Lisbon System for the International Registration of Appellations of Origin and Geographical Indications.⁶⁰

Prior to taking over as Deputy Director General for the Brands and Designs Sector in 2009, she worked in a number of other roles at the organization, including Assistant Director General of Administrative Support Services and General Assembly Affairs (2006–2009); Executive Director of Administrative Support Services and General Assembly Affairs (2003–2006); Director of Inter-Office and General Assembly Affairs in the Office of Strategic Planning and Policy Development (1999–2003); Senior Counselor in the Office of Strategic Planning and Policy Development (1997–1999); Counselor and later Senior Counselor in the Office of the Director General (1994–1997); and Senior Program Officer in the Bureau for Development Cooperation for Asia and the Pacific (1992–1994).⁶¹ Before transitioning her career to WIPO, Ms. Wang served in a number of positions at China’s State Administration for Industry and Commerce (SAIC), including Managing Director for the China Trademark Service and Acting Director General for the Department for Registration of Enterprises and Foreign Companies.⁶² She received her bachelor’s degree in English, communication, and transportation from Zhongnan University in 1975. In 1985, she received her diploma in American commercial law from Columbia Law School, and in 1986 she received her LL.M in U.S. law, including industrial property law, from the Law School of University of California Berkeley.
