

Lindsey Ford, Adjunct Senior Fellow, Center for a New American Security



Lindsey W. Ford is a leading expert on Indo-Pacific security issues with two decades of experience across senior roles in government and the policy community. She served as the Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for South Asia at the National Security Council from 2024-2025, where she oversaw all U.S. issues related to India and South Asia, including helping to manage the US-India Initiative on Critical and Emerging Technologies. From 2021-2024, she served as the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for South and Southeast Asia. In this capacity, she oversaw the conclusion of the first Roadmap for U.S.-India Defense Industrial Cooperation and established the Defense Department's first Indo-Pacific defense innovation initiatives, including a US-India defense incubator and a Quad maritime technology program. Ms. Ford is currently an Adjunct Senior Fellow with the Center for a New American Security and has previously served in senior research roles at the Brookings Institution and the Asia Society Policy Institute.
