

Professor Andrew S. Erickson, China Maritime Studies Institute, U.S. Naval War College



Dr. Andrew S. Erickson is Professor of Strategy (tenured full professor) in the Naval War College's China Maritime Studies Institute. A core founding member, he helped establish CMSI in 2004 and stand it up officially in 2006 and has played an integral role in its development; from 2021–23 he served as Research Director. Erickson is currently a Visiting Scholar at Harvard University's John King Fairbank Center for Chinese Studies. He serves on the editorial boards of *Naval War College Review* and *Asia Policy* and is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. His research website is www.andrewerickson.com.

Erickson has received the Navy Superior Civilian Service Medal, the Naval War College's inaugural Civilian Faculty Research Excellence Award, and the National Bureau of Asian Research's inaugural Ellis Joffe Prize for PLA Studies. Erickson's latest coedited volume, *Chinese Amphibious Warfare*, has been named the Samuel B. Griffith Foundation's 2025 Publication of the Year and selected for the Commandant of the Marine Corps Professional Reading Program's 2025 and 2026 Reading Lists.

Erickson is the author of the book *Chinese Anti-Ship Ballistic Missile Development* (Jamestown Foundation/Brookings Institution Press, 2013). He is coauthor of two other books: *Gulf of Aden Anti-Piracy and China's Maritime Commons Presence* (Jamestown/Brookings, 2015) and *Assessing China's Cruise Missile Ambitions* (National Defense University Press, 2014). Erickson is the editor of, and a contributor to, three volumes: *Maritime Gray Zone Operations* (Routledge Cass Series: Naval Policy & History, 2022/paperback 2024/open access 2026), *Chinese Naval Shipbuilding* (Naval Institute Press, 2016/paperback 2023), and *Proceedings of the 47th History Symposium of the International Academy of Astronautics* (Univelt, 2015). He is coeditor of, and a contributor to, thirteen volumes; including *Chinese Undersea Warfare: Narrowing the Gaps* (Naval War College Press, forthcoming 2026) and *China's Future Nuclear Submarine Force* (Naval Institute Press, 2007/China Ocean Press translation 2015).
