

**Margaret Myers, Senior Advisor, Asia and Latin America Program, Inter-American Dialogue**



Margaret Myers is managing director of the Johns Hopkins SAIS Institute for America, China, and the Future of Global Affairs, senior advisor to the Inter-American Dialogue, and an adjunct researcher with the Núcleo Milenio sobre los Impactos de China en América Latina. She has published extensively on China's relations with the Latin America and Caribbean region, including in her co-edited volumes, *The Political Economy of China-Latin America Relations* and *The Changing Currents of Trans-Pacific Integration: China, the TPP, and Beyond*. Myers has testified before the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate on the China-Latin America relationship and is regularly featured in major domestic and international media. She is a member of the faculty at the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies. Myers previously worked as a Latin America analyst and China analyst for the US Department of Defense. Myers was a Council on Foreign Relations term member. She was the recipient of a Freeman fellowship for China studies, a Fulbright Specialist grant to research China-Colombia relations in Bogotá, and a Woodrow Wilson Center fellowship.
