

Dr. Victoria Chonn Ching, Non-Resident Fellow, Atlantic Council



Victoria Chonn Ching is a non-resident fellow at The Atlantic Council’s Adrienne Arsht Latin America Center. She holds a Ph.D. in Political Science and International Relations from the University of Southern California. She also has an M.A. in Chinese Studies from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. Her work focuses on the Latin America-China relationship, highlighting host country agency, economic statecraft, and the dynamics between foreign and domestic policymaking. Her research has also examined Chinese investment in Latin America, with special attention to the extractive industries, and how host countries actors at the national and local levels have engaged with and responded to Chinese firms, and the implications for the development of bilateral relations.

Dr. Chonn Ching’s publications include “A Comparative View of Chinese Relations with Peru” in *China, Latin America, and the Global Economy* (2023) and “The Complex Dance Around China’s Overseas Projects” (2023) with Alvin Camba, and “Conceptualizing China-Latin America Relations in the Twenty-First Century: the Boom, the Bust, and the Aftermath” (2018) with Carol Wise.
