Andrew Lohn is a Senior Fellow at Georgetown University's Center for Security and Emerging Technology (CSET). He leads the CyberAI Project which focuses on ways that AI will change cyber offense and cyber defense. The CyberAI Project also works to anticipate what the future of AI will be by studying the underpinnings of the technology such as financing, computing chips, algorithms, and the progression of both open and closed models.

Lohn was recently a visiting scientist at MIT's Futuretech studying the economic and technical requirements of AI and he previously served as a Director for Emerging Technology on the National Security Council Staff, Executive Office of the President in 2023 and 2024. Prior to joining CSET, he was an Information Scientist at the RAND Corporation, where he led research focusing mainly on cybersecurity and artificial intelligence. Prior to RAND, Andrew worked in material science and nanotechnology at Sandia National Laboratories, NASA, Hewlett Packard Labs, and a few startup companies. He has published in a variety of fields and his work has been covered in MIT Technology Review, Gizmodo, Foreign Policy and BBC. He has a PhD in electrical engineering from UC Santa Cruz and a Bachelors in Engineering from McMaster University.
