

Johannes Petry, Senior Researcher, Goethe University Frankfurt



Johannes Petry is a Senior Researcher at Goethe University Frankfurt and Research Fellow at the University of Warwick. He is a political economist examining post-crisis transformations of global finance and the shifting norms, institutions, and governance that underpin the world economy. Specifically, his research focuses on China's financial development and internationalization, the politics of financial infrastructures, the governance of non-Western financial systems, as well as the geopolitics of global finance, including the renewed use of currencies, networks, and capital flows as tools of geoeconomic strategy.

Previously, he held positions at the University of Bonn, the SCRIPTS Cluster of Excellence and holds a PhD from the University of Warwick. He is the co-author of "BRICS and the Global Financial Order" (Cambridge University Press, 2024), co-editor of "States, Capitalism and Finance in Emerging Markets" (Bristol University Press, 2025) and author of "Capital Markets with Chinese Characteristics" (Cornell University Press, forthcoming). He is also an editor of the *Review of International Political Economy*.

Dr. Petry testified before the Commission for its 2021 hearing on "U.S. Investment in China's Capital Markets and Military-Industrial Complex."
