She is President and CEO of the Long Term Strategy Group (LTSG), a Cambridge, Massachusetts-based defense research firm. She is also a Senior Fellow at the Foreign Policy Research Institute in Philadelphia and an Affiliate of the Weatherhead Center for International Affairs at Harvard University. At LTSG, Dr. Newmyer manages a team of researchers whose work covers geographic areas and functional issues relevant to the future security environment. Recent studies that Dr. Newmyer has authored or co-authored have focused on China's approach to long-term strategic competition, Chinese assessments of US power, and the role of human rights issues in a long-term strategic competition. Dr. Newmyer has also written about China's approach to the current "Revolution in Military Affairs" and the logic of China's increasing military presence in the Indian Ocean region. She has testified before the US-China Economic Security and Review Commission on Chinese military modernization and Chinese influence operations in the United States.



Dr. Newmyer has held postdoctoral fellowships at the Belfer Center for Science & International Affairs at Harvard's Kennedy School of Government and at the Olin Institute for Strategic Studies in the Government Department of Harvard's Faculty of Arts & Sciences. She has been published in a range of outlets including the *American Interest*, the *New York Times*, the *Journal of Strategic Studies*, *Orbis*, *Policy Review*, the *Weekly Standard*, and she has appeared on CNN to explain developments such as Chinese sailors' harassment of the USNS Impeccable. Dr. Newmyer is a *summa cum laude* graduate of Harvard College and earned her M.Phil. and D.Phil. degrees at Oxford University (New College). Prior to entering the national security field, she worked as a journalist and as an investment analyst.
