DR. JOHN S. PARK Senior Research Associate (Northeast Asia), U.S. Institute of Peace

Dr. John S. Park focuses on Northeast Asian security, economic and energy issues and U.S. foreign policy toward the region. He directs USIP's Korea Working Group, a consultative body comprising senior experts from the government and think tank communities, which is chaired by Dr. Richard Solomon. He is co-director of the U.S.-China Project on Crisis Avoidance and Cooperation, as well as the U.S.-ROK-Japan Trilateral Dialogue in Northeast Asia.

Previously, Dr. Park was the project leader of the North Korea Analysis Group, a Managing the Atom working group at the Harvard Kennedy School. His recent publications include, "The Rise

He has also commented on Northeast Asian security issues on BBC World Service, CNN, CNBC Asia, Bloomberg TV, NPR and Reuters.

Dr. Park received his Ph.D. from Cambridge University. He completed his predoctoral and postdoctoral training at the Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs at Harvard University.
