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Denmark's research and policy expertise is in the politics and security of the Indo-Pacific, and in U.S. strategy toward the region. He is the author of the forthcoming book *Empowering Allies: A Strategy for a New Era in the Indo-Pacific*, and is the co-editor of *Strategic Asia 2013-14: Asia in the Second Nuclear Age* (National Bureau of Asian Research, 2013) and *Strategic Asia 2014-15: U.S. Alliances and Partnerships* (NBR, 2014).

He has testified multiple times before the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, as well as the U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission. His commentary has been featured in several major media outlets, including *Foreign Affairs*, CNN, National Public Radio, the *New York Times*, the *Economist*, the *Financial Times*, *Foreign Policy*, and the *Atlantic*.

Denmark previously served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for East Asia and worked as Senior Vice President for Political and Security Affairs at The National Bureau of Asian Research, a Fellow at the Center for a New American Security, and held several positions in the U.S. Intelligence Community.

In January 2017, Denmark received the Secretary of Defense Medal for Outstanding Public Service. He is also a recipient of the Order of the Resplendent Banner from the Republic of China (Taiwan), and is an Honorary Admiral in the Navy of the Republic of Korea. He is a member of the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations and the Council on Foreign Relations.

A Colorado native, Mr. Denmark holds an MA in International Security from the Josef Korbel School of International Studies at the University of Denver, and received a BA in History with Honors from the University of Northern Colorado. He has also studied at Peking University. He lives with his wife and children in Maryland.
