Peter Chalk is an adjunct senior analyst with the RAND Corporation in the United States. He has analyzed such topics as unconventional security threats in Southeast and South Asia; new strategic challenges for the US Air Force in Latin America, Africa, and South Asia; evolving trends in national and international terrorism; Australian defense and foreign policy; international organized crime; the transnational spread of disease; and US military links in the Asia–Pacific region.

Dr. Chalk is associate editor of *Studies in Conflict and Terrorism*, one of the foremost journals in the international security field. He has testified before the US Senate on issues pertaining to transnational terrorism and piracy and is author of numerous publications and books on various aspects of low-intensity conflict in the contemporary world. Besides his RAND affiliation, Dr. Chalk acts as a subject matter expert on maritime security with the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California and works as a contractor for several organizations that provide professional executive education to security and government officials around the world. Before coming to RAND, Dr. Chalk was an assistant professor of politics at the University of Queensland, Brisbane, and a postdoctoral fellow in the Strategic and Defense Studies Centre of the Australian National University, Canberra. He earned his Ph.D. in political science at the University of British Columbia, Vancouver, Canada.
