Christopher D. Yung, Ph.D., is the Donald Bren Chair of Non-Western Strategic Thought and the Director of East Asian Studies at Marine Corps University. In this capacity he teaches at all of the associated schools within the Marine Corps University umbrella (e.g., the Marine Corps War College, the School of Advanced International Studies, the Command and Staff College, and the Expeditionary Warfare School). Dr. Yung specializes in Chinese strategy, foreign policy, the People's Liberation Army, and China's naval and expeditionary capabilities. He has published articles, chapters in books and reports as well as served as editor for numerous publications on Chinese strategy and policy issues. Previously he was the Senior Research Fellow at the Center for the Study of Chinese Military Affairs (CSCMA), Institute for National Strategic Studies, National Defense University and he provided research, analysis and policy recommendations for the Office of Secretary of Defense, the Joint Staff, and the Intelligence Community. Dr. Yung also previously served as Senior Research Analyst at the Center for Naval Analyses (CNA). He received both his Ph.D. and Master of Arts in International Relations from the Johns Hopkins University, School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS).
