Katherine Eban, an investigative journalist, is a *Fortune* magazine contributor and Andrew Carnegie fellow. Her articles on pharmaceutical counterfeiting, gun trafficking, and coercive interrogations by the CIA, have won international attention and numerous awards. She lectures frequently on the topic of pharmaceutical integrity. *Bottle of Lies: The Inside Story of the Generic Drug Boom*, her second book, is a *New York Times* bestseller and was published by Ecco/HarperCollins in May. Based on a decade of reporting, the book reveals endemic fraud and dire conditions in the overseas manufacturing plants where the majority of our low-cost generic medicine is made.
