Elsa Kania is an analyst at the Long Term Strategy Group. Her research focuses on the People's Liberation Army's advances in and approach to emerging technologies. She is a graduate of Harvard College (*summa cum laude*, Phi Beta Kappa), where her thesis on the PLA's strategic thinking on information warfare was awarded the James Gordon Bennett Prize. Elsa presented her research on U.S. and Chinese approaches to cyber deterrence at the inaugural U.S.-based International Conference on Cyber Conflict (CyCon U.S.), and she has participated in workshops and dialogues on issues of cyber strategy and military cyber stability. Elsa was a 2014–2015 Boren Scholar in Beijing, China, and she is proficient in Mandarin Chinese. Previously, she interned at the Department of Defense, the Carnegie-Tsinghua Center for Global Policy, and FireEye, Inc. While at Harvard, she also worked as a research assistant at the Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs and the Weatherhead Center for International Affairs.
