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Dr. Holly Wang is a professor at the department of agricultural economics, Purdue University. Dr. Wang is specialized in Chinese food and agricultural economic issues, US-China agricultural interactions, and agricultural risks, especially focusing on food safety, consumer preference, and insurance. She has published hundreds of articles in world leading agricultural economics journals and other media, delivered keynote speeches and talks in over 15 countries in the world, and been interviewed multiple times by NPR and CCTV on Chinese agricultural issues. She received the Outstanding Paper Award twice with her coauthors from the Emerald Literati Network, and the Quality of Communication Award from the Agricultural and Applied Economics Association (AAEA). Dr. Wang has also served on several leadership positions for her profession, such as the executive board director of the Agricultural and Applied Economics Association, the founding chair of its China Section, president of the Chinese Economists Society, and as co-editor of China Agricultural Economic Review.

She received her Ph.D. degree from Michigan State University, and her B.S. degree from Tsinghua University, China.
