Andrew Scobell is a senior political scientist at the RAND Corporation. Prior to this he was an associate professor of international affairs at the George H.W. Bush School of Government and Public Service and director of the China certificate program at Texas A&M University in College Station, Texas. From 1999 until 2007, he was associate research professor in the Strategic Studies Institute at the U.S. Army War College and adjunct professor of political science at Dickinson College, both located in Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

Dr. Scobell is author of *China's Search for Security* (Columbia University Press, 2012) with Andrew J. Nathan, *China's Use of Military Force: Beyond the Great Wall and the Long March* (Cambridge University Press, 2003), more than a dozen monographs and reports, as well as dozens of journal articles and book chapters. He has also edited or co-edited more than twelve volumes on various aspects of security in the Asia-Pacific region, including *PLA Influence on China's National Security Policymaking* (Stanford University Press, 2015) with Phillip C. Saunders. Dr. Scobell was born and raised in Hong Kong and regularly makes research trips to the region. He earned a doctorate in political science from Columbia University.

Dr. Scobell testified before the Commission at its 2002 hearing on "Chinese Leadership Succession and Its Implications," its 2008 hearing on "China's Expanding Global Influence: Foreign Policy Goals, Practices, and Tools," its 2010 hearing on "China's Activities in Southeast Asia and the Implications for U.S. Interests," and its 2011 hearing on "China's Narratives Regarding National Security Policy."
