Dr. Balbina Hwang is Visiting Professor at Georgetown University and American University. From 2007 to 2009, she served as Senior Special Advisor to Ambassador Christopher Hill, Assistant Secretary for East Asian and Pacific Affairs, at the U.S. State Department. From 2009 to 2010, she taught courses on Northeast Asian security at National Defense University in Washington D.C. Prior to joining the State Department, she was Senior Policy Analyst for Northeast Asia in the Asian Studies Center of The Heritage Foundation, a think tank.

Dr. Hwang, a native of Korea, was a Fulbright Scholar to South Korea in 1998–1999 where she conducted doctoral dissertation field research. She is the author of numerous articles and book chapters. She has received several writing awards, including ones from the International Studies Association and the National Capital Area Political Science Association. She has provided expert testimony before Congressional hearings, and is a frequent commentator for major international media outlets, including CNN, BBC, NPR, PBS, and the *Wall Street Journal*, among others.

She is a founding and current member of the National Committee on North Korea; a board member of the Korean Overseas Women’s International Network; and is an elected board member of Council for Security and Cooperation in the Asia Pacific.

Dr. Hwang earned her doctorate in Government from Georgetown University; a Masters of International Affairs from Columbia University; an M.B.A. from the Darden Business School at the University of Virginia; and a B.A. in Philosophy and Government from Smith College. She has also taught at George Washington University and the University of Maryland.
