Dr. Smith is the senior fellow for Japan studies at the Council on Foreign Relations. She also teaches at Georgetown University’s Asian Studies Department and is the vice chair to the U.S.-Japan Conference on Cultural and Educational Exchange, an advisory panel of government and private sector experts that fosters U.S.-Japan cultural ties. Previously she directed a research team on the effect on domestic politics of the U.S. military presence in Japan, South Korea, and the Philippines at the East-West Center. She also served as a visiting scholar at Keio University in Japan where she studied Japan’s foreign policy towards China and has been a visiting fellow at two Japanese think tanks—the Japan Institute of International Affairs and the Research Institute for Peace and Security.

Dr. Smith is the author of *Intimate Rivals: Japanese Domestic Politics and a Rising China* (Columbia University Press, 2015) and *Japan’s New Politics and the U.S.-Japan Alliance* (Council on Foreign Relations, 2014). She has also authored dozens of articles on Japan, China, and the United States engagement with Northeast Asia and frequently contributes to major media outlets on these subjects in the United States and Asia. She earned a masters and a doctorate from Columbia University.
