Dr. Phillip C. Saunders is Director of the Center for the Study of Chinese Military Affairs and a Distinguished Research Fellow at National Defense University's Institute for National Strategic Studies. He previously worked at the Monterey Institute of International Studies, where he served as Director of the East Asia Nonproliferation Program from 1999-2003, and worked on Asia policy issues as an officer in the United States Air Force. His research focuses on Chinese foreign policy, security policy, and military issues.

Dr. Saunders is co-author with David Gompert of *The Paradox of Power: Sino-American Strategic Restraint in an Era of Vulnerability* (NDU Press, 2011) and co-editor of *Chairman Xi Remakes the PLA* (NDU Press, 2019) and *PLA Influence on China's National Security Policymaking* (Stanford University Press, 2015). He has also edited NDU Press books on Chinese contingency planning, China-Taiwan relations, the Chinese Navy, and the Chinese Air Force and published numerous articles and book chapters on China and Asian security issues.
