Dr. Richardson serves as the China director at Human Rights Watch. She is the author of numerous articles on domestic Chinese political reform, democratization, human rights, and issues in Hong Kong. Dr. Richardson has testified before multiple organizations, including the European Parliament and the Congressional-Executive Commission on China.

Human Rights Watch has written extensively about the persecution of activists and scholars in China and has raised many well-known cases including Liu Xiaobo, Gao Zhisheng, Chen Guangcheng, Rebiya Kadeer, the Panchen Lama, Huang Qi, and Tan Zuoren.

Dr. Richardson is the author of *China, Cambodia, and the Five Principles of Peaceful Coexistence* (Columbia University Press, Dec. 2009), an in-depth examination of China's foreign policy since 1954's Geneva Conference, including rare interviews with policy makers.

Dr. Richardson is a graduate of the University of Virginia, the Hopkins-Nanjing Program, and Oberlin College.
