Patrick Woodall is Research Director and Senior Policy Advocate at Food & Water Watch, a non-profit consumer organization that works on food policy and water infrastructure issues. Mr. Woodall is an expert on issues related to the globalization of food and agriculture, international trade, and agriculture policy, and has done extensive work on China's investment into the U.S. agriculture sector.

Mr. Woodall is the coauthor of a book on the World Trade Organization, titled *Whose Trade Organization? A Field Guide to the World Trade Organization* (New Press, 2004). He has written dozens of reports and articles on public policy, including analysis of how international trade impacts farmers and agriculture, consumer safety oversight, the environment, and workers.

Mr. Woodall received his bachelor's degree from Johns Hopkins University with concentrations in international relations and economics.
