Michael Vickers is Senior Vice President, Strategic Studies at the Center for Strategic and Budgetary Assessments. He was the senior adviser to the Secretary of Defense for the 2005-2006 Quadrennial Defense Review. He has consulted extensively to the Pentagon on the Global War on Terrorism and Force Transformation.

From 1973 to 1986, Mr. Vickers served as an Army Special Forces Officer and CIA Operations Officer, with extensive operational and combat experience in Central America and the Caribbean, the Middle East and Central Asia.

During the mid-1980s, he was the principal strategist for the largest covert action program in the CIA's history: the paramilitary operation that drove the Soviet army out of Afghanistan and played a major role in ending the Cold War. His Afghanistan experience is described in the New York Times bestseller and soon-to-be-released major motion picture starring Tom Hanks, "Charlie Wilson's War."

Mr. Vickers holds advanced degrees in business administration from the Wharton School and in strategic studies from Johns Hopkins. He will soon be completing his Ph.D. dissertation at Johns Hopkins on the structure of military revolutions.
